The hearing set for 10 a.m. before Judge Lincoln F. Mahan... The most critical report of jail conditions remained a petition prepared by four inmates who claimed the prisoners were forced to live like animals in circumstances of disease, filth and indignity that would impede even the most heroic surgery.
