Harris Edits Angela 'Diary'

SAN JOSE, Calif. (UPI)—An 8-page "diary" Angela Harris sent to "Solidad Brother" George Jackson was edited down to seven pages Thursday by the prosecutor, who said it was vital to the state's case in the murder, kidnap and conspiracy trial.

Judge Richard E. Aronson, who on Tuesday ruled the document inadmissible as evidence on grounds much of it was "irrelevant," said he would spend the three-day weekend studying the pared-down version.

He met behind closed doors for three hours Thursday with attorneys for both sides after dismissing the jury for the week on Wednesday. The panel was excused after Assistant State Attorney General Albert W. Harris Jr. responded to questions on having the diary-type documents entered as evidence.

Harris said the document was of "critical importance" in proving the state's contention that Miss Davis was so in love with the black revolutionary that she helped plot the Marin County shootings of 1970.

The 26-year-old former UCLA philosophy instructor and avowed Communist is specifically charged with supplying some of the guns used by Jackson's younger brother, Jonathan, when he entered the courtroom of Superior Judge Harold A. Haley, released three convicts, and took the judge and four other hostages. Jackson, the judge and two kidnapers died in an escape run outside the courtroom.

The state claims the hostages were taken to gain release of George Jackson and two other "Solidad Brothers" charged with the killing of a prison guard. The older Jackson was killed last August during an alleged escape attempt from San Quentin prison in which five others died.

Judge Aronson was expected to rule on the "diary," found in George Jackson's bloody cell after he was killed on Monday or Tuesday.

He will also rule next week on the legality of attorney John Thorne's refusal to answer questions concerning Jackson, who was his client.

Newton Is Arrested For Assault

OAKLAND, Calif. (UPI)—Black Panther leader Rex P. Newton was arrested with his bodyguard late Thursday on misdemeanor charges involving assault.

The 38-year-old Panther party founder was arrested along with Robert L. Ray, 28, in the garage at Newton's plush apartment building overlooking Lake Merritt.

They were arrested on a warrant sworn out by Harbor South, a day before for radio station KPIX. Scott said Newton and Ray beat him April 16 during an argument at the Rainbow Lounge.

Newton, leaving the jail after posting \$700 bail, said 15 policemen "pushed me around" when the arrest was made. He said he was "out-riggered" by the Police Department, which he said had a "personal vendetta" against him. Ray was released on \$1,250 bail.

"None of this was necessary," said Newton, who was tried three times for the slaying of Oakland policeman John Fry in 1967.

Two Men Arrested In High-Speed Chase

Two men were arrested yesterday after a chase with speeds up to 100 miles per hour on Highway 101 and 90 miles per hour on streets through Petaluma.

Jack Virgil Altmquist, 30, of 41 Straub Lane, Petaluma, was arrested on suspicion of felony hit and run driving and assault with a deadly weapon, his passenger, Noel Harold Cutler, 31, of San Francisco, was arrested on suspicion of assault with a deadly weapon. Both posted \$1,500 bail to appear May 8 in Southern Sonoma Municipal Court.

Police said the chase began at 2:48 a.m. when the car was stopped for speeding at East Washington and 62nd Streets. Before officers could reach the car it sped onto the freeway southbound and was chased at speeds up to 110 miles per hour.

The car was later traced to Alamo and was arrested at his home.
