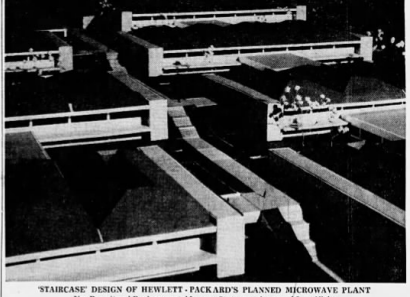

The storm front, located west of the city, will bring rain to the area, ending the cold spell.

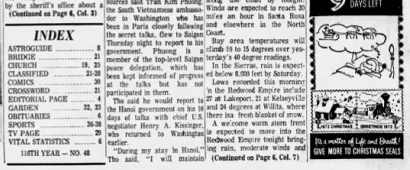
