EPA Administrator William R. Ruckelshaus said today that the agency will require auto makers to destroy their 1973 models to shut down illegal "defeat devices" on certain engine conditions.
The agency is not yet certain, he added, of cause of death in not known, because of the condition of the body as estimated that death occurred sometime after Dec. 3, when temperatures dropped below freezing.
