Inmate at Chino Killed; 2 Injured

CHINO — (UPI) — One prisoner was stabbed to death and two others wounded yesterday in a fight which broke out at the Reception and Guidance Center of the California Institution for Men.

The dead man, Rudolph Castro, 35, Bakerfield, was stabbed at least 30 times, according to the San Bernardino County Coroner.

The injured man, Gilbert Sandwell, 34, who was reported in very critical condition at the USC County Medical Center, and Steven Orsola, 36, who suffered only minor cuts and bruises.

Sandwell was sentenced from Los Angeles after a 10-day trial in San Bernardino County for robbery.

Prison officials said the fight erupted shortly after officers opened the doors on the second lot of cells to release 31 prisoners into a recreation yard.

During the brief fight, Castro and Sandwell were either pushed or fell from the second lot down to the first level. Prison spokesman C. J. Villalobos said reports that the fight was related to racial hatred at the prison were "substantively untrue."

"We feel it may have been connected with a stabbing incident last Friday," he said. "In that case, two brothers were attacked and stabbed as they were about to step into the recreation yard."

The brothers Ernest Aranda, 21, and Santos, 22, were in satisfactory condition at the prison hospital.
