## Police Identify Victim of Grisly Murder

The identity of a woman whose severed head was found by children last week was confirmed by police Wednesday as that of a 25-year-old woman identified as Arley Bell Killian, who lived with her family at 824 S.E. 17.

Mooreville police located the victim's mother, Henry Lee Killian, 23, also of 824 S.E. 17, into jail Wednesday morning after it was determined he had escaped from Central State Hospital in Norman, where he is a patient.

Investigators said Killian was detected minutes from the hospital Thursday, the day his sister's head was found.

Detectives said the man has been questioned in the mutilation case but stopped short of calling him a suspect.

Reports show Killian was arrested three days after she was strangled and a haircut in barber two days following to his conviction.

Arley P. Caldwell.

Last year he was arrested after allegedly attacking Mrs. Caldwell with a steak knife during an argument.

The woman's head, savagely parried from her body, was found Thursday in an alley in the 800 block of S.E. 10. Police later found the woman's left hand, a chunk of flesh and portions of her petticoat currently left by the killer.

Fingerprint taken from the hand gave investigators a tentative identification which was then confirmed through dental records and the woman's family Wednesday.

Police said the victim was a white woman of Indian descent.

"It appears my money, many poor leads and avenue of investigation," said Sgt. Robert V. Wilkie, detective division commander, persons who know the woman said she last week should call the homicide unit, Wilkie said.

Wilkie and Lt. Dennis Bergan, homicide commander, said the kill-

ing woman had a "very minor" police record that did not include any arrests.

Wilkie said very little is known about the victim's background. Detectives spent much of Wednesday afternoon interviewing the victim's family, Bergan said.

"We're starting from the family end," Bergan said. Detectives said police they last saw the victim alive several hours before the woman's head was discovered.

But investigators continued to pursue background from the Killian home late in the afternoon without developing any significant suspect leads.

Detective Don Pennington said investigators will not expand their probe to friends and associates, saying there are dozens of persons who need to talk with about the exact time she was last seen.

A psychological profile developed by police indicates the killer is likely to be a reclusive man with peculiar tendencies. The profile also suggested the killer may have a history of mental illness.

The Bernards were shot to death in the basement of the Warren home.

Coleman's trial was scheduled for June 1.

"I'm frustrated," Turner said. "I'm frustrated because obviously the FBI is good at what it does and I wish we could have their help. It's an unfortunate situation that we can't have better resources to look for the guy."

"We can't use hypnosis or appreciation like we can't find him, so he must be out of state."

Coleman, 32, escaped Monday from the Muskogee County Jail.
