From Smith's arrest last August a few months after he was evicted out of the principal's job, to remove attending Mrs. Bickner's brutal murder in June, it has been shock after shock for residents of Upper Merion, a township that has withdrawn from a rural community of 6,000 people into a suburb of 20,000.

The residents and the students are not as skeptical as they once were of reports of bizarre behavior, even as much as the reports.

"It is not that they do nothing to a devil worship cult," Michael Baker, author of an Upper Merion High School senior, said of the teachers last week.

"I really feel that Jay Smith had something to do with the Dupain teachers' strike, with Bradford and a couple of other teachers," he said.

It was feelings such as these that led students and parents last Monday to demand that Bradford, Ms. Myers and Valente be fired. Dr. Charles A. Scott, the superintendent of the Upper Merion schools, said the parents that the three could not be legally fired but that he would reassign them to non-teaching positions.

One of the teachers is to work on correction materials in the administration building and another is to work on programs at the district correctional, residential center in Bridgeton. The third teacher also will work in Bridgeton, but in another office and at another job, Scott said.

The separation of the teachers, he said, is intentional.

## Boy beaten, burned near playground

LANCASTER, N.Y. — Timothy Rodgers, 6, is recovering — in a hospital — from an attack Wednesday in which he was beaten and burned slightly by two men who, his doctors are concerned about the young boy's emotional state.

The youngster's mother expressed concern yesterday about the emotional state of one of her daughters, Lucille Rodgers, and expected that her daughter Lorin might have witnessed the assault, because the girl had not spoken since.

Mrs. Rodgers said the two suspects had "beaten up" two of her daughters the week before the assault on Timothy.

On Friday, police arrested a 13-year-old Hempstead, N.Y. boy for the assault on Timothy, which took place in a nearby state park. A second suspect, said to be 12 years old, remained at large, his whereabouts said his wife, "is unknown."

Police for Adams County District Attorney Denis Dilco said the 13-year-old would be taken to Family Court on Tuesday to answer charges of juvenile delinquency.

Richard Hermann, a Merco Hospital spokesman, said Timothy was "in satisfactory condition and doing very well. He seems to be healing nicely."

Medical officials, however, feared the emotional damage the experience might have done to the boy and said he had been placed under the care of psychiatrists.

Timothy told police that the two boys beat him with his head under water and burned him with a cigarette lighter.

Police said the boys dragged Timothy from the swings at a playground, forced him through a hole in a fence and took him behind a wooded area to the shore of Hempstead Lake.

The boy suffered four fractured ribs and a sprained arm. He also had cuts and bruises over his body.

The attackers were scared off by two girls riding bicycles in the area. Timothy was found covered with track, bleeding and crossed out in a "chart."

The girls told police they thought they had killed the boy, but that they had his head and legs, respectively, "I'm dead."

## Miss, crash site yields 2 more dead

GOOD HOPE, La. — First signs Wednesday in a freighter's hold that a body had been found in the wreckage of a bus that crashed into a barge two days earlier.

St. Charles Parish Coroner Earl Altman identified the man as John Adams, 47, a resident of the Parish. He had been the driver of the bus, which was owned by the Ing Captain Norman, who was not at the accident Thursday.

A passenger on the ship still was missing. Other bodies were being pulled from the wreckage, which left 16 people hospitalized.

The bus was towed to New Orleans, where the Coast Guard is to start hearings Thursday to find out why the freighter's rubber-tired landing gear landed on a docked barge loaded with 67,000 gallons of oil.

The dock alone sustained \$4 million worth of damage from the resulting oil spill, the fire, according to a spokesman Friday by his owner, GATX Terminal Corp.

The fire engulfed the barge's bridge, destroying instruments that might have indicated what caused the accident. Ralph Johnson, a National Transportation Safety Board investigator, said Friday.

Lt. Steve Sheek, a Coast Guard investigator, said a preliminary check of the freighter's steering mechanism for failure the barge-impact upper deck did not reveal any obvious breakdowns.

More than two dozen men were injured when the barge struck the ship and set fire to the nearby rig. Of those still hospitalized yesterday, five crewmen from the bus and one from the rig were in critical condition, hospital officials said.
