Continued from Page C1 to her neck and hands were visible.

Salyers promised to abide by any conditions set by his wife, Felice, sobbed beside him, caressing him to calm his nerves in front of the judge's bench.

"I'm sorry Mr. Salyers, but due to the nature of this case, I don't feel I can set a bond," Edwards said.

The judge had earlier been told that Salyers was charged in 1980 with being a fugitive from justice when he fled to Kentucky after being charged with an act of violent burglary. Commonwealth's Attorney W. Parker Council opposed setting a bond on the basis that he continues to pose a danger to the community.

Salyers was returned to jail and his case continued for one week while his family tries to make arrangements with an attorney to defend him.

Salyers told Edwards that local attorneys had refused to take the case and the family was having trouble retaining a lawyer because the victim was an attorney.

After the hearing, Mrs. Spencer, whose law office is in the Hilton area of Newport News, said she attempted the bond hearing to make sure Salyers was not released. "I'm glad the judge released him. I'll feel more secure," she said.

Southfield Police Chief Clarence Havens said Salyers has not made a statement to investigators, but Mrs. Spencer has identified him as the man who attacked her.

Williamsburg Suspect sought

Williamsburg Crime Line is seeking information about a man wanted in connection with a Nov. 1 rape in Mineral Manor.

The man entered a new section of the motel at Richmond and New Hope roads about 11 p.m. and went to the fourth floor.

A motel employee preparing coffee for the room answered a knock on the door. When she opened the door, the man forced his way inside, pushed her against a wall and then the floor, where he raped her. The man left a few minutes later.

Woman dies in crash

YORK — A county woman died Thursday when she apparently lost control of her car and it went off Route 132, hit a tree and derailed.

Both Jones Green, 55, of 120 Selby Lane, died at the scene of the accident, about half a mile east of Bypass Road, said State Trooper L. D. Shelton.

Mrs. Green was traveling eastbound about 10 a.m. when "unknown reasons" she swerved into the westbound lane, back into her lane and finally off the road, Shelton said. Her car went up an embankment, struck a tree and overturned.

Mrs. Green, the only occupant, was thrown about 16 feet and was dead when police and rescue units arrived, Shelton said.

"There is no indication of excess speed and it doesn't appear to be alcohol-related," he said.

When asked why more information has not been released to the public so far, Wagner said "There's not much to release."

Hampton Shooting unresolved

The shooting of a Hampton man during a robbery attempt at his home Oct. 28 remains unresolved, and city police are hoping a Crime Line tip will result in the arrest of the perpetrator.

Shortly before midnight, James C. Edwards of the 800 block of North King Street answered a knock at his door after hearing a man's voice saying someone was throwing rocks at Edwards' business across the street. Edwards opened the door and found two men, one armed with a sawed-off shotgun and the other with a small-caliber handgun. The two demanded money from Edwards and when they did not get any, shot them, shot Edwards in the chest.

Edwards was treated at Hampton General Hospital and released.

The two armed men ran north on King Street toward Rip Rap Road.

The first assailant was believed to be in his mid-20s and about 5 feet 11 inches tall. He was black, had a medium build and short hair and was wearing a beige jacket, police said. The second man was also black and in his mid-20s. He stood about 5-foot-7 and weighed about 150 pounds.
