Attorney general rules against church on sewer

YORK — The state attorney general's office has ruled it would be illegal for the county to reimburse Bethel Baptist Church for work done last summer to get a public sewer hook-up.

Inadequate. Had the church taken that advice in 1982, the tapen would have been in vain. That development emerged Friday just before the county received word of the attorney general's opinion.

Smith also claims a high-ranking county official whom he would not identify told him the county would pay for at least some of the work, but no one admits to saying that.

Friday's opinion sustains a similar one by County Attorney Thomas W. Allen, who was publicly chastised last week by the court on Monday asking the court to prohibit the supervisors from paying the \$6,901 claim.

The supervisors haven't voted to appropriate the money, but they approved the claim Sept. 3. The whole issue would be made moot if the supervisors decide to disapprove the claim, Henne said.

The church leaders, however, have six months from Friday to decide whether to sue the county.

What's fair is fair, and this is not fair, Tabb Smith said.

Friday there would not have been insufficient gravity flow where the county told the church it could have tied into the line in 1982, a violation by the county of its sewer ordinance.

Since then, the church paid half of a tapin fee and quarterly fees before successfully hooking up to the line last summer.

Henne said that if the attorney general's office had had that information, the opinion it issued might have been different.
