Pastor autopsy shows neck wounds were fatal

Multiple wounds, including mutilation of her left breast, most likely were inflicted after she died, said Brent Tarver, a private forensic scientist and criminal profiler, and an adjunct professor with Oklahoma City University.

Neither the state medical examiner's office nor the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation would comment inside the church shortly before service time Sunday. Authorities said the Oklahoma City woman died of multiple sharp-force injuries.
