Q13 features unsolved 2002 slaying of two on Thanksgiving night at Tacoma home

The Thanksgiving night slayings of a young woman and 5-year-old boy in Tacoma will be featured this weekend on Q 13's Washington Most Wanted.

Kimberly Riley, a 19-year-old University of Washington student, and Jeremy Britt Bayinthavong, 5, were killed the night of Nov. 28, 2002, as they hung out at a home in the 1000 block of South 75th Street. Two others were injured.

An unknown gunman walked up to the house and fired into a lower-level window. A witness reported seeing a dark, older-model, full-sized Ford pickup truck speed from the scene. The truck had a light-colored canopy, a loud exhaust system and the word FORD written on the tailgate.

The case has remained unsolved despite a \$25,000 reward.
