The plan would start by reserving 150 spots for single-occupancy vehicles and 50 for carpools or Vanpools, totaling less than 10 percent of the 2,400 parking spots available. More reserved spots eventually could be set aside or rates adjusted based on demand. Permit holders would need to show proof of at least 12 verified transit trips per month via bus, vanpool or Sounder train. Carpooling permit holders would need at least two passengers meeting that same requirement. Pricing for the permit would depend on participants: OCA or ORCA LIFT members would go toward the program's cost and to help maintain the Tacoma Dome Station. The goal also is to "give people more certainty and flexibility in finding a parking spot, thus making transit trips more appealing," Rebecca Japhet, Pierce Transit's communications manager, told The
