Carter Vetoes Clinch River Reactor Bill

WASHINGTON, Nov. 5—President Carter vetoed Saturday his first bill. It would have authorized \$60 million for a nuclear breeder reactor.

Other reasons for vetoing the bill, Carter said, were that the bill would authorize the president in providing international policy to prevent the proliferation of nuclear weapons.

...The bill covered Congress on Oct. 28. It was reported in the House and passed by voice vote in the Senate and 20 in the House...
