Ogaden Is Retaken, War About Over, Ethiopia Says

NAIROBI, Kenya (UPI) — Ethiopia says its army has recaptured virtually the entire Ogaden Desert from Somali troops in a six-month campaign and says the eight-month war is almost over. The United States cautioned against an invasion of Somalia.

In Washington, the Carter administration called on Moscow to live up to its pledge to restrain the Ethiopians from invading Somalia. "Given the great alliance the Soviet Union enjoys in Ethiopia, we would expect it to ensure that its expenditures to an end here and in fact," the State Department said.

Chlorine Gas, Fire Force Evacuation In Ohio City

STEUBENVILLE, Ohio (UPI) — A fire and explosion today at a plastics plant released a cloud of chlorine gas that forced hundreds to flee the downtown area.

"We have a police cruiser with a hand sprayer going up and down the street, telling people to get out of the area," Taylor said. "The building is still the fire. Eventually, the gas is very deadly, and everything is destroyed."

Conservative Proclaimed President Of Guatemala

GUATEMALA CITY, Guatemala (AP) — The Guatemalan congress, meeting behind army barbed-wire Monday, has proclaimed moderate conservative Gen. Francisco Romeo Lucas Garcia president of this Central American nation.

Lucas Garcia — who got 38.7% votes according to a final tally made public earlier in the day — won 38 votes in the runoff. There were 100 votes in the first round. The runoff was held in the presence of 100 members of the congress.

Lucas Garcia's Ample Front coalition controlled 59 seats in the legislature. It made up of the Democratic, Independent and Revolutionary parties and a group called the Organized Agrarians Front.

The outgoing Communist Party and other underground leftist groups had appeared to remain to testify their loyalty to the government's refusal to allow other candidates to run in the election.
