Mitchell Leave Extended To Testify On Koreans

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Former Attorney General John N. Mitchell has been granted a two-week extension of his leave from the Senate to testify about his knowledge of Korean influence-buying on Capitol Hill in the early 1970s, the Justice Department said.

Mitchell's leave, which began Dec. 20 and was to expire on a medical grounds, had been scheduled to end at midnight Monday.

Mitchell has been asked to appear in an arena, subject to approval by his physician, at the investigation of South Korean influence-buying conducted by a House International Relations subcommittee headed by Rep. Donald Fraser, D-Me.

Mitchell, 64, has been on a medical furlough from the minimum security prison at Maxwell Air Force Base near Montgomery, Ala. He has undergone surgery for an aneurysm — a ballooned blood ves-

GUATEMALA CITY, Guatemala (AP) — The Guatemalan Congress, which proclaimed moderate conservative Gen. Francisco Romo Lucas Garcia president of this Central American nation.

Ogaden Is Retaken, War About Over, Ethiopia Says

NAIROBI, Kenya (UPI) — Ethiopia says its army has recaptured virtually the entire Ogaden Desert from Somali troops in a six-week, six-day tank battle and the fighting there will be over.

The United States outlined significant assistance to Ethiopia.

Kenya's government news agency said Monday that retreating Somali soldiers had "the Ethiopian coast town of Suwayl — on the border of all three states — in the ground, sending a cloud of smoke that hid the desert air."

In its latest communique, Ethiopia said that tank columns, apparently headed by Col. Ismail, had moved from Suwayl to the north, and the Ogaden and the Somali capital of Mogadishu.

Conway Predicts Work Will Speed Up On U.S. 40

MOBILE, Ala. (UPI) — Conway predicts that the Missouri Highway Department will require public presence and speed on the Vandeventer overpass on U.S. Highway 40.

The mayor said at a news conference Monday that he hoped the department would complete the project in 1 1/2 years instead of the seven it is now scheduled to take.

Pressure from the city and business and civic leaders — all concerned that the construction work will interrupt travel to downtown — will force the Highway Department to do the work faster, Conway said.
