

Woman quits job after being scolded for aiding victim

NAPLES — A 19-year-old Naples woman quit a job as a drugstore cashier after she was scolded for leaving her cash register to help a dying heart attack victim.

Miss Hunter had been a part-time clerk for six weeks at Gray Discount Drug Store in Gulf Gate Plaza in East Naples.

Friday, she was on duty about 5:30 p.m. when a man she had waited on moments before rushed back into the store, asking for someone to call an ambulance for his wife.

Mrs. Theresa Julien, 71, had suffered a massive heart attack, according to her husband Arthur.

Miss Hunter, a trained emergency medical technician who works during the day at the Naples Community Hospital laboratory, said she left immediately to the parking lot and began trying to revive Mrs. Julien.

Ambulance attendants said the woman was still clinging to life when they arrived, as the result of help given by Miss Hunter and others. Mrs. Julien died later Friday at the hospital.

When Miss Hunter returned to the drug store, Bill Holland, the assistant manager, told her she had erred in leaving her cash register unattended during the emergency.

Miss Hunter said Holland said her she shouldn't have left the store with her four company checks on her cash drawer, and she left without telling me where she was going.

Illinois man still sought in probe

A statewide alert was issued Thursday for the 22-year-old Kane, Lefflaw is asking that anyone who might have information on the man's current location should call the sheriff's office at 628-2101.

The sheriff declined any further comment on Kane, but did say police agencies throughout Florida and in other areas have been asked to assist in locating him.

Kane is described as being 6 feet 2 inches, 160 pounds, with brown hair and blue eyes. He is believed to be driving a car with Illinois license plates.

To date, more than 75 persons have been questioned in connection with the Oct. 12 murder of the 12-year-old Pier Charlotte girl who was abducted and burned to death in a field about three miles from her home, according to Byron Stinson, public information officer for the sheriff's office.

One of those questioned was Phillip Lee Drake, 20, of 191 Orlando Blvd., Port Charlotte. Drake was arrested last week on charges of perjury.

According to Assistant State Attorney Gene Berry, Drake is not a suspect in the murder but is believed to have knowingly made a false statement while testifying under oath.

Court records state that Drake denied knowing his 1972 Chevrolet to anyone on Oct. 12, the day Linda was murdered, or on the following two days. Lefflaw said his department has learned that Drake "did loan his car to some friends on that date."

"We are very anxious to question Brian Patrick Kane regarding the Linda Pikuritz homicide. We believe Kane has important information that could lead us directly to the person or persons responsible for this incomprehensible killing," said Charlotte County Sheriff Alan Lefflow.

"I have a big store here, and I'm responsible for it," Holland said.

Miss Hunter said Saturday he was sorry the girl who tried to help his wife had quit her job. "We will make mistakes in an emergency," he said.

Miss Hunter said Saturday she did not leave her register unattended since two other women were behind the counter when she left to assist Mrs. Julien.

Holland said he only wanted to caution the girl to be sure her cash register was protected when she left it. He said she was emotionally upset, and he called her resignation "hasty."
