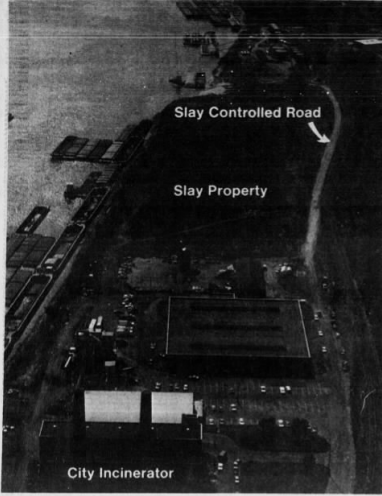

South County's Bombing Puzzle

William Ohlhausen, whose girlfriend died in the blast of the "South County bombings" two years ago and who himself was seriously injured in a fourth bombing, was in a motel across from the site of the second bombing the night before the explosion, authorities here said last Thursday. It is the first disclosure that Ohlhausen was known to have been in the area where Robert C. Jackson, a United Parcel Service employee, was killed Oct. 18, 1977.

Ohlhausen's attorney said Ohlhausen would not comment on the investigation. The attorney pointed out the lack of investigative findings where no indictment was reported. Ohlhausen, 38, now is living on the West Coast. The bombings began Oct. 7, 1977. A Missouri Co. employee occupied injury after a bomb placed under his car in the

parking lot of a Melville apartment complex did only minor damage. However, days later, an apartment complex a few miles away, Jackson was killed by a bomb that had been placed under the rear of a Buick LeSabre days after that. Shirley Marie Pyle, 32, was killed by a car bomb at a nearby apartment complex where she and Ohlhausen had rented together for about three years. And Ohlhausen was seriously injured March 7, 1978, when a bomb exploded under his truck outside a motel in Paducah, Ky.

Congress Pushes Heating Aid

WASHINGTON — Senate members of Congress are taking an unprecedented step to help the poor pay their heating bills this winter. "The important thing is to get the bill passed before the start of the heating season," said Sen. Jacob K. Javits, R-N.Y., sponsor of a \$1.2 billion emergency fuel assistance provision that received final Senate approval Wednesday.

The House Speaker Thomas P. O'Neill Jr., D-Mass., who made an unprecedented appearance before a House panel to speak in behalf of \$2.5 billion in aid. The first session of the 96th Congress faces no higher priority than providing low-income fuel assistance to meet the winter's needs," he said.
