Judge quits suit on city in Valley

The Valley incorporation lawsuit needs a new judge. Spokane County Superior Court Judge John Schlabach said Friday he has stepped down from the case because he knows some of the people involved.

Schlabach said he made the decision on his own, after reading the case file. The court administrator's office has been asked to find a new judge for the dispute, which involves political and business leaders from the Valley as well as the county commissioners.

Last Nov. 8, the county Boundary Review Board approved a petition that would allow voters in the Valley to decide whether they want to form their own city. The petition was filed by Citizens for Valley Incorporation, a group that contends the area could get better representation by becoming a city.

Guilt admitted in shooting

A Gonzaga University student from Microtona pleaded guilty Friday to second-degree manslaughter for a shooting that prosecutors said was largely to drinking.

William Wilmer Nettle, 21, 8729 Dimes, admitted in Superior Court that he accidentally shot and killed his friend from that South 77th office when, alone, he fired from that South 77th office.

The shooting occurred the early morning hours of Aug. 2 at 19143 Standard, where Nettle lived, Joppy Prosecutor Fred Caruso said. Caruso said there was an evidence Nettle intended to shoot Dimes, and that there was a strong bond between them. He said the pair had been drinking for some time before the incident.

Suspect held in robbery try

A Spokane man has been booked into Coconino County Jail on a charge stemming from a Dec. 16 incident that police think might have been a robbery.

John P. Peterson, 22, 20113 Chocomaui, was charged with attempted first-degree robbery and held in lieu of \$5,000 bond.

The incident involved a motorist who said he gave a ride to two women who identified themselves as "Bobbi" and "Kathy," who may be prostitutes, a police spokesman said. The victim took the women to the 82700 block of Riverside, a sparsely populated area near railroad tracks.

Peel's murder trial to begin Tuesday

KETCHIKAN, Alaska (AP) — Opening arguments are to begin Tuesday in the manslaughter trial of a man accused of killing a woman in a bar in Ketchikan, Alaska.

Opening arguments will begin Tuesday with District Attorney Mary Anne Heery, who expects to take most of the day. Defense attorney Philip Paul Wender and Bruce McGee will share opening arguments.
