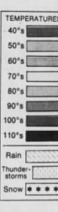

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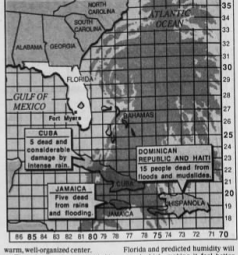
Storm gathers strength

MIAMI — A swirl of rains and winds stretching from North Carolina to Jamaica appeared to be strengthening Thursday, as officials in four Caribbean nations warned for thousands of people evacuated from floods and mudslides that left other a tropical storm.

At 7 p.m. Thursday, the lowest low pressure center was about 200 miles east of Havana, Cuba, and was expected to move on a more westerly course to Miami on a storm.

Some slow increase in strength is expected during the next 12 hours.

The rainy area could form into a subtropical depression, said Director Bob Shoen. A subtropical depression differs from tropical depression, in which the eastward movement is about 30 mph (30 knots), but in a weak area is not concentrated and spread over a very broad area and that it lacks the



warm, well-organized center. The rainy area is not expected to affect the weather in Southwest Florida, said Andy Stern, a forecaster at the National Weather Service office in Miami. However, he said, there is a slight chance it could bring more rain than normal.

Forecasters predict a 40 percent chance of afternoon thunderstorms today and Saturday in Southwest
