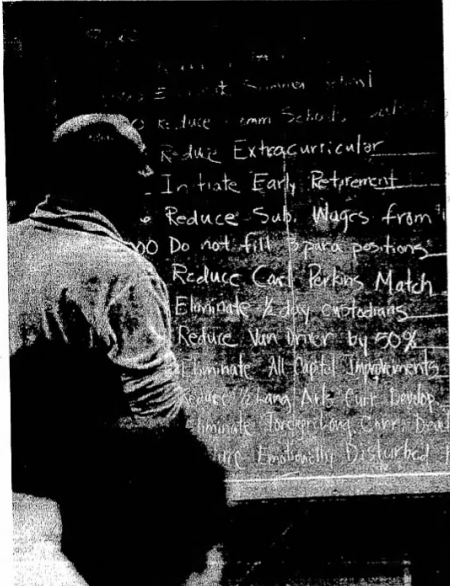

Salmon Catch Large But Prices are Low
By JUNEAU (AP) — Southeast Alaska fishermen are hauling home large catches of salmon, but prices are low.
The commercial salmon harvest in Alaska has topped 100 million fish for the seventh year in a row, and the Department of Fish and Game expects that when the season ends next month, the total catch will have topped Alaska's fisheries close to the \$70 million they earned last year.
