Toutle Lake students to vote on voluntary drug testing

TOUTLE, Wash. (AP) — Students in the Toutle Lake School District are to vote Monday on whether they want to participate in a drug-testing program that school officials say is aimed at showing serious drug problem exists.

Under the plan developed by students at Toutle Lake High School, two students will be chosen each week by lottery from a group of 10 to 150-grade volunteers to have their urine tested for drugs. The district would pay the \$20 cost of the test.

Officials approved the plan over a number of reasons, said Seattle A.C.L.U. executive director Kathleen Ryan. "It is a tradition of law to be tested in the first place. Adams said all parents of the approximately 270 students eligible for testing will be asked to sign whether their children can participate. For a student to take part, the child and his or her parents must all give permission, he said.

Adams said the program probably won't be available until after Thanksgiving, and a decision on whether to carry out the testing won't be made until Dec. 18, he said.

Adams said the program probably will be dropped if permission isn't obtained for at least 75 percent to 80 percent of the students. Eighty-four percent of the 320 questionnaires who participated in the earlier survey said they would be willing to take weekly urine tests.

Clark, director of the Washington State School Directors Association, said he knows of no similar testing program in the state, though some districts try to help students and staff who have drug or alcohol problems.

In Seattle, school officials Wednesday approved a strong anti-drug program after hearing testimony from parents, teachers and students. The program includes a ban on use and sale of drugs and alcohol, widespread "drug-free" signs, and a "drug-free" pledge for students and staff.

Jury leader in Peel trial faces quiz

KETCHIKAN (AP) — A Ketchikan judge said Wednesday prosecutors and defense attorneys will be allowed to quiz the jury foreman in the first investor lawsuit in the history of the state.

Justice Court Judge Thomas Schulz signed an order giving the lawyers one chance to question the foreman, who presided over six days of deliberations that ended Aug. 21 in a hung jury.

Schulz placed a gag order on jurors after Eckstrand sent him a note that day saying the state won on and three men couldn't reach a unanimous verdict on any count against him.

Opposing lawyers spoke to Eckstrand privately after his motion is heard the jury's votes on respective counts. Eckstrand said he would like state Attorney General Hal Brown before he decided in October to pursue retrial.

Justice Attorney Mary Anne Henry asked Wednesday for access to Eckstrand, the 51-year-old managing editor of the Ketchikan Daily News. Schulz promptly granted the request, but ordered that none of the discussion be made public.

Henry said she wants an opportunity to question the foreman to get a general impression of how the trial went.

Henry said it would be very helpful, depending on what Henry has to say. Henry said "it might make a difference in how I prepare."

Her motion suggested that a chat with Eckstrand might make the retrial significantly shorter, and may assist the state in preparing for its retrial. She said the attorney could narrow the trial, as was evidence and witnesses were significant to jurors' eyes.

Peel returned to his hometown of Ketchikan, Wash., in the custody of his family after his six-month trial ended inconclusively. He is accused of murdering their members of the Mackinac Island family and their relatives in September 1982 and murdering his book for identity evidence.

Peel was arrested in November 1984 and released on \$1.1 million in cash and property bonds in May 1985.

The second trial is scheduled to begin Jan. 19, but the Public Defender Agency has asked for a delay to allow another of its attorneys prepare for the case.

Alaskan launches balloon to Siberia
NOME, Alaska (AP) — James Stimpfle has found a novel way to promote tourism in this town by the frozen sea — letting weather balloons launch Siberia with payloads of balloons, ice and clothing items.

The first Siberia balloon was launched Tuesday, but a lack of balloons caused it to drift about a mile offshore, Stimpfle said. It was retrieved by a couple of fishermen and brought back to Nome.

Stimpfle said Wednesday he will try again when prevailing winds seem right to carry the balloons 100 miles across the Bering Sea from Nome to Siberia. He would like to make balloon launches a monthly event.

This week's balloon carried balloons, sewing needles, beads, gum and clothing items.

The whole idea of this is to promote tourism in this area, he said. "There were the traditional kinds of things that people would trade."

Also included are messages written by local school children in English, Russian, and two Eskimo languages.

There are no political or religious kinds of messages, just friendship and trade, said Stimpfle, a real estate broker and insurance agent.

So how does all this relate to tourism?

The Cold War put an end to travel between Alaska and Siberia, but Stimpfle and other members of Nome's chamber of commerce would like to see the coast of Siberia opened to Western tourists. That, he felt, would attract people to Nome, he said.

Along with monthly balloon launches, Stimpfle plans a winter-travel campaign in the U.S. State Department and Soviet officials.

"If there's a positive response to the Soviet side, there may be a few selected sites where cruise ships could land with tourists," he said.
