County sheriff's detective who testified Thursday said he didn't think the seat found in the back of Scott's car was important when it was first discovered in 1978.

In the deposition, former chief investigator Jim Jones said, "The seat was so good because the Shell Factory sells them by the cartload." Jones stated by that statement when he testified Thursday.

One of the main questions Johnson has consistently raised involves the timing of the discovery of the evidence and Scott's arrest. Although the seat and the hair were found in the car in 1978, Scott wasn't charged with the murder until 1981.

If evidence was so incriminating, Johnson has asked, why wasn't Scott ever arrested immediately?

Lawyers have claimed that although a criminal autopsy allowed them to finger Scott as the killer.

However, Ryland said Thursday, "I don't know why assistance wasn't requested from another agency."

that the park's entry and exit roads would not interfere with plans to widen Kings Highway.

The developer also must agree to build a 2,300-square-foot hurricane shelter club house.

Michael Rayman, a Punta Gorda lawyer who represents South Beach Enterprises, assured the council that the conditions would be a problem. The firm already has given the county a 15-acre strip of land along Kings Highway, he said. And in exchange, he said, South Beach Enterprises wants credit toward its development expenses.

As for the hurricane shelter, Rayman said, the firm plans to construct a building large enough to protect hundreds of people who live outside the park.

The council's recommendations will now go to the state Department of Community Affairs, South Beach Enterprises has 90 days to submit its Development Regional Impact to the council and state and local officials.

More than 1,000 people have said they would like to move into the park, Rayman said. And if all goes as planned, he said, park construction could start as early as June or July.

### Road work to jam bridge, but Cape to benefit by wait

Motors using the Cape Coral bridge will have to pay a price in temporary inconvenience, but officials say the eventual payoff will be a remedy for Lee County's worst traffic headache.

"Traffic will be disrupted for the next few months, but after that it will be cleared up the worst traffic jam in the county," said Lee County Commissioner Porter Cook Thursday at a press conference for the parallel span for the Cape Coral bridge.

Elected officials said they were pleased to see that the work was finally getting under way, five years after the county voted to build the bridge.

Cape Coral Councilman George Strupp said, "I'm so happy I could cry."

Strupp called the bridge one of the best examples of that cooperation between the governments of Lee County, Cape Coral and Fort Myers could do.

But some said the parallel bridge will solve only part of the problem.

"I haven't been there in a while, but I know that as an alternative to the mid-point bridge, they are absolutely wrong," said Cape Coral Mayor Joe Manbeck.

He was referring to the more controversial proposal for a bridge between Cape Coral and Fort Myers.

At a point about midway between the Cape Coral and the Charlotte Harbor Bridge (U.S. 41),

Actual construction on the parallel span will begin Monday, said Dennis Hines, representative of contractor Harper Bros. Inc., the contractor building the Cape Coral approach to the bridge.

On Monday the construction workers will be digging to the south of the existing road on the Cape side.

Hines said that within three weeks a temporary span should be in place. Once traffic is flowing on the temporary span, construction can begin on the south side where the approach to the new bridge will go. The new bridge will be to the south of the existing bridge.

Since actual construction won't begin until the temporary span is in place, Hines hopes the flow of traffic will not be slowed significantly.

There will still be two lanes open while construction is taking place.

Cape Coral police will be watching the situation, and if needed, will direct traffic, police spokesman Frank Brant said.

Hines said how much the traffic will be slowed depends on the materials and how slowly they drive through the construction.

A slowdown in traffic could affect some local businesses. Pat Corbett, manager of Good Furniture stores in Cape Coral, said he has trucks that go across the bridge every day.

### Microanalysis is not new

While he didn't analyze the seat until 1980, he said he was doing microanalysis for the Florida Department of Law Enforcement when Pizarro was killed nine years ago.

Jones said the sheriff's department didn't have the expertise to do extensive criminal testing at the time. Pizarro was murdered, he said, but didn't know why assistance wasn't requested from another agency.

The state is expected to conduct its own tests. Part of Scott's testimony is to involve the hair that was found in the back of Scott's car. While James on Thursday testified about the discovery of the hair in 1978, his testimony was offered to indicate that seat showed the hair belonged to Pizarro.

If convicted as charged of first degree murder, Scott could be sentenced to die in Florida's electric chair, or to life in prison with no parole for at least 25 years.

### In other business, the council decided that Del Toro North—a manufactured housing project—will not threaten the neighborhood woodpecker that lives along the Charlotte-Leo County line.

Del Toro North is a proposed Lee County "country club" that would be along U.S. 41 on the county line. The development would consist of 2,700 mobile homes, a golf course and a 16,000-square-foot shopping center.

The project concerns environmental groups, but under the council, the office of Environmental Services said the woodpecker, an endangered bird, nests in at least 12 trees in the area.

Before the project is given approval, environmental officials, who developers should comply with strict guidelines, including a tree and woodpecker management plan.

The council agreed, noting that many of the environmental conditions already have been met.

Developers plan to add a bird habitat to construction plans, the council staff said. And "buffer" land around the park will protect the woodpecker's "active nests," they said.
