(AP) - The pilot of a commuter plane that crashed in flames shortly after taking off from Seattle-Tacoma International Airport said he knew he had only one chance to save himself and the 10 others aboard. "There wasn't much time available," said Carl Carlson, who headed in for an emergency landing even though he knew he was too high and going too fast.
