# Albany schools expecting 7,200 pupils this fall

Albany public schools expect around 7,200 students to be enrolled for the coming year. School registration dates are coming up in August, the district has announced. Classes will start Sept. 4.

Students who preregistered last spring need not register again unless they have changed addresses since the summer.

In addition to registering, kindergarten students will be scheduled for interviews with teachers to help determine the skill levels of individual children and the class for a while.

Kindergarten registration is planned at the elementary schools on Aug. 28.

West Albany High's times and dates, juniors and seniors, meet on 6 p.m. Aug. 22. Freshmen and sophomores, meet on 8 p.m. Aug. 22. Aug. 23 and 24, registration will be by appointment only.
